June 18th is the day we begin our Summer Sundays practices. **Tai Chi Chih**® is a simplified tai chi / qigong form consisting of 19 standing movements and one pose. These gentle movements help release stress by relaxing the body. Practice can also improve memory, circulate energy and promote balance, both physically and mentally.

Beginners will learn the entire Tai Chi Chih form.
