Nine of us met on Sunday to discuss *The Last Days of Night*. We had a great time!

The book we are reading next is *JUST MERCY*, a true story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson. Bryan Stevenson was a gifted young attorney when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending the poor, the wrongly condemned, and those trapped in the furthest reaches of our criminal system. One of his first cases was that of a young man sentenced to die for a notorious murder he did not commit. The case drew Stevenson into a tangle of conspiracy, political machination and legal brinkmanship. The book will be discussed at 3 pm on Sunday, November 10, at the home of Huda and Jochen Kraske, 4550 North Park Avenue, Apt. 410, Chevy Chase, Md. 20815, phone 301 656 2087. All are welcome, even if they had not read the book.

The book we will be discussing in January is *News of the World* by Paulette Jiles.
