Redeemer Book Group

The book we are reading now is *JUST MERCY*, a true story of Justice and Redemption by Bryan Stevenson. Bryan Stevenson was a gifted young attorney when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending the poor, the wrongly condemned, and those trapped in the furthest reaches of our criminal system. One of his first cases was that of a young man sentenced to die for a notorious murder he did not commit. The case drew Stevenson into a tangle of conspiracy, political machination and legal brinkmanship. All are welcome, even if they had not read the book.
